HINDUS TAKING CASE DOWN TO
L O N D O N.

VANCOUVER DELEGATES WILL BRING VIEWS AS TO
IMMIGRATION RESTRICTIONS BEFORE THE HOME
GOVERNMENT.

THE HINDUS OF THE CITY have sent to London, England, three delegates, who will present to the British Government authorities there the conditions that govern their coming to Canada. The three delegated are Balurant Singh, priest of the Sikh Temple here; Narain Singh, flag-bearer, and Rand Singh of Berkeley University, who will act as interpreter.

The party left the City on Friday evening at 6 o'clock. They have decided to go direct to London and not interview Mr. Borden, because, they say, he has failed to keep his promise of a year ago when he said he would remedy the prevailing conditions. The Secretary of State for India and the Colonial Secretary are those who will be approached by the Delegation.

The influence of the Indian National Conference, representing the people of India, the Sikh Educational Conference, representing the sikhs, and the Indian Mussulman League, representing the Mohammedans, will be sought to bring the matter to satisfactory settlement, if the delegates fail in their mission to London.
