Sir:-

Referring to your letter dated August 8th.,  
file C.P.C.168-8 re the suggestion from Col. A.P.  
Sherwood that it would be advisable, after due con-  
sideration, to cease the censorship of the ordinary  
Hindu and Chinese messages, beg to state that after  
carefully considering matter with our mutual friend,  
and while we realize that the censoring of the ordinary  
Hindu messages entails a considerable amount of work, this  
has in two cases been of great importance, and especially  
so in the case of a message filed on August 15th., so that  
we deem it inadvisable for the present to discontinue  
censoring the Hindu messages.

With reference to the ordinary Chinese messages,  
our friend suggests we continue to receive these as in the  
past, and until he has received further word from the War  
Office, re certain translations which have been submitted,  
so in view of this I trust you will see your way clear to  
allow matters to stand as at present, or until we can fur-  
ther advise you regarding same.
