Dear Sir,


I have your favour of the 7th instant, No. 27.

Since its receipt, one of the Inspectors has been to the boat and informed by you that the individual referred to is no longer in the condition you state.

Insofar as medicines are concerned, we have written to your Medical Officer, that under the terms of the charter, Gurdit Singh must supply medicines, that I will give him every assistance in my power in the purchasing of same and taking the supplies to the boat. This offer has been communicated verbally as well as in writing, and when Dr. Monroe called upon your ship's doctor and offered his assistance, Gurdit Singh refused to allow your doctor to come ashore for this purpose.

In the event of any of your passengers being taken ill and cannot be treated on board the ship, I desire that you immediately notify me.
