Sir:-

I enclose herewith copy of a communication received from Dr. Raghunath Singh, with reference to the Komogata Maru.

I further embody provisions of proposed agreement of transfer of charter from Gurdit Singh to two local Hindus, H. Raheim and Bahg Singh:

1. The payment in cash of the sum of \$15,000.44, as per a pro forma account dated 9th June 1914, herewith enclosed.
2. Deposit with C. Gardner Johnson & Company the sum of \$1,600.00 for the installation of wireless which is required by the Dominion authorities, and to pay for boat hire, patrolling and Customs Officers' time, and enter into a covenant to pay all Port charges or other expenses which may be imposed upon the ship or owner while the ship remains in Port.
3. Pay the sum of \$10,307.00 being two months' hire from the 1st of June 1914, and covenant to pay in advance two months' hire being \$10,307.00 for every two months from the 1st. August 1914, during the existence of the Charter Party.
4. Deposit with C. Gardner Johnson & Company the sum of \$200.00 per day for each day the ship remains in this Port for the food of the Hindus on board; failing payment of \$200.00 in advance on any such day, the ship to be at liberty to proceed to Hong Kong.
5. Deposit the further sum of \$6000.00 with C. Gardner Johnson & Company to supply food estimated for 30 days for the voyage from this Port.
6. Pay \$250.00 being costs of owner's solicitors here, now due, and all further costs which may be by owner incurred while the ship is here.

I doubt very much if they can comply with the demands of Messrs C. Gardner Johnson & Co.
