I am most happy to report to you that I have just returned from the Komogata Maru with Immigration Agent Mr. Malcolm R.J. Reid, Mr. Hopkinson and committee of the local Hindus, and a final and amicable arrangement has been made to the effect that the ship shall leave the harbour immediately steam can be got up, which will be in about twelve or fourteen hours.
