Sir,

In continuation of my report of the 15th inst I beg to advise you that Taraknath Dass now known also by the name of Jogendro Nath Dass returned to Colfax, Cal, on the 18th inst, He is employed there by the Pacific Gas and Electric Co as Asst. General Foreman over Greek labourers.

As already stated he was invited by telegram to attend a meeting at 1936 Bonita Ave, Berkeley, Cal, in the interests of the Hindustan Association of the United States of America, of which he is an active member, by Har Dayal, the Pacific Coast Secretary of this organization. From what I am able to gather it appears that notwithstanding the opposition put forward by Har Dayal, Dass, Gobind Behary Lall, Sarangdhur Dass, Ranjit Singh, Kedar Nath and other members of the Nationalist party, an association has been formed and style themselves as "Loyalists" with B. S. Sarma of Madras as President and H. E. Pandion, also of Madras, as Vice President. This association consists of about 16 members, all students of the University and intend to remove from the quarters occupied by Har Dayal and his party. During the meeting it was proposed to ask Mr A. Carnegie Ross, British Consul General in this city, to be the Honorary President but the matter was turned down on a vote.

he will speak on "The Revolutionary Labour Movement in France: its Lessons and Dangers". I intend to be present at this meeting. I secured one of these cards from a member of the Industrial Workers of the World at a weekly street meeting this organization holds every Saturday on Grant Avenue in this and at which I was present on the 18th inst. I was also informed that Har Dayal would speak at the I. W. W. Headquarters at 8 P. M. on Sunday the 19th inst which I also attended. What transpired at this meeting is hard to describe. Socialism, Anarchism and all matters pertaining to Political agitation were talked about until Mr Har Dayal appeared on the scene. He is apparently well connected with this organization and if I am informed correctly is the Secretary of the Branch of the Industrial Workers of the World organization in San Francisco.

His entry into the Hall was hailed with great applause as the leading Indian reformer and a Saviour of the down-trodden Indian people. Har Dayal's discourse was on the present agitation in India and the methods of those connected with it. That it was his intention to organise and establish an association on the same principals as the I. W. W. for the benefit and uplifting of the people of India. He stated that he was not prepared to disclose in public the methods his

people were employing to further agitation but that although ~~every~~ every effort had been made by an alien race to oppress the people of India and keep down agitation and enlightenment, there were under currents at work which would yet prove the downfall of the British Government in India. I did not stay the length of his lecture as my surroundings were composed of a very questionable class of humanity. The Hall is located on Seventeenth Street between Market and Valencia in the down-town and toughest party of the city.

The Hindustan Association of the United States of America has its Headquarters in Chicago, Ill. and the President is one Y. M. A. Nanded Kar, address P. O. Box 700, Chicago, Ill. Certain resolutions I am informed were forwarded by the Hindustan Association to a Mr Mudholkar, President of the Indian National Congress which is to meet in Bankipore, India.

S. M. Bose I am told worked for the International Harvesters Co in Chicago, Ill. but whether he is there now I am unable to find out.
