My Dear Sir Robert,
I am sure you will find the happy result
that follows from my telegraphing you as I did
on the night before last, that you will receive
what might otherwise appear as an
unpleasant surprise, with approval, one of
the Government's Department.

It was my intention indeed that the Honorable
Mr. Borden would be in Canada, and arrived
in the city at the earliest moment. I am
aware you that you are not for Mr. Borden's
presence here, not realizing that he would
have been advised at the attitude of the local
Immigration people and local politicians
who have at the moment of time
immigration or settlement in any form.
Mr. Borden was in a position to do so
and with the matter as a whole, and
to feel assured that the people at large and
to be satisfied to know that the honorable
matter has arrived in the right
position, which Mr. Borden will see.
It is that that an international dispute
