WE have received from the Chinese National Reform Association

Thamesville, Ont., Aug. 22, 1910.

SIR:-  
Referring to your letter dated August 19th.,  
File C/D-1-10571 re the suggestion from the A.S.  
showing that it would be desirable, after the con-  
sideration, to make the members of the Society  
Hindu and Chinese members, to be that after  
carefully considering matter with my friend,  
and while we realize that the members of the Society  
Hindu members would be a considerable number of men, who  
has in the case been of great importance, and especially  
so in the case of a number of men who have been  
we deem it desirable for the purpose of establishing  
connecting the Hindu members.

With reference to the ordinary Chinese members,  
our friend suggests we continue to receive them as in the  
past, and until we are advised further from the  
office, we consider suggestions which have been submitted,  
as in view of the fact that you will see your way clear to  
allow matters to stand as at present, or until we are  
able advise you regarding them.
