44. Swami Trigunatita to W.C. Hopkins
San Francisco [October, 1911]

Dear Mr. Hopkins,

Please pardon me for my writing to you this way after so long a time. If I don't do something like this, then nothing will be done at all. You know the reason; you found out that I required a few clerks to conduct my work methodically.

I thank you for your kind letter of Oct 23, 1911 and for the package of "Statesmen".

I don't think we shall get time to read newspapers so much. So, it is better for you to send your postage stamps and your time to pack and send. Although I thank you, dear Mr. Hopkins, for your kindly sending in the paper, and especially for your not forgetting what you said you would do.

You have kindly asked me whether Tarak N. Doss and his colleagues are giving me trouble. They are! —

On Oct 24, in the evening, Tarak N. Doss, Suran Bose, and another associate came here. I asked Tarak N. Doss not to come any more at all and told him I would not let him in. He tried to come forcibly (of course he didn't try
