SIR,

Referring to my visit to Washington, D. C. I beg to report herewith the case of Mrs. SATAN, with an A. Certificate, the U.S. Commissioner General of Immigration.

I have been informed that her record in this case has not yet been received from San Francisco, and this being the attention for Consular approval. As yet all the books were not before him, he, however, advised me that as soon as the record was received he would forward it on to the San Francisco, which would allow with satisfaction to let me see it.

Mr. Goodell informed me that from the little information in the possession he was afraid that the Department would have no jurisdiction in the matter owing to the fact that Mrs. Satan's claim that he was more than three years in the United States before any action was taken, had been verified. As expressed the utmost regret that owing to a confusion in the case, his officers had misdealt.

Action should have been taken long ago in this case but owing to the confusion, as stated in my letter of the 11th of April last, File # 2, the matter has not been pending by the U.S. authorities, believing that there was plenty of time to permit action being taken later on. When the record was forwarded to me this afternoon that Mrs. Satan of San Francisco was not the same Mrs. Satan who was at the Hotel Utah, 1914, of Vancouver, B. C. and that the Department was too late.

When the record is received from San Francisco the same will require further consideration at the hands of the Department. It is not known if a copy has been sent to the Department or if it will be later sent.
