Sir:-

I beg to report that ~~in the~~ ^{on Friday last} in the presence of Mr. McGill, a man named Kumar Singh made over to me the under noted newspapers which he said he had extracted from C. D. Kumar's room, and it is evident from the circulation by him of these papers that similar papers are received by Kumar and circulated by him. He also informs me that Kumar's paper, "The Hindustan" contains articles taken out from the papers under noted, and circulated among the Hindus.

On the perusal of these papers it can be seen that the names and addresses found in Kumar's note book were those of the publishers of these different newspapers. I have noted in the papers the dates of my letters pertaining to my particular statement made therein and of which I have advised you previously.

I am informed by different Hindus that a man named Gurmukh (or Gurmukh) is making extensive inquiries among them, but the nature of the inquiries I have not been able to learn as yet. For the first time ^{on Friday} Kumar held a meeting from religious point of view, at which some twenty or thirty Hindus were present, and in the course of the conversations he advised these Hindus
