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Sir,

I have been able to secure a little more of interesting information regarding Kumar and Dase.

With respect to Kumar I beg to state that on the 25th inst. he appeared before a Board of Inquiry at the C.I. Immigration Office here and applied for admission to Canada. After a long sitting the Board composed of four of Council decided to admit Kumar and he accordingly, after having received sanction, left Vancouver on Friday the 26th inst.

Today I am informed that Kumar professed to have been intended to return in this city a vessel about fitted to sail for the Salween. I am unable at the present moment to confirm this information, but have asked the C.I. Immigration Service at Seattle to let me know as soon as possible the date, steamer and port of destination, if Kumar leaves on any boat from that port.

With regard to Dase, I am informed from a reliable source that he has been trying to ferry parties in connection with securing his naturalization papers, for which he made application some years back. In connection with the matter of Dase (the narrative now was connected with the C.I. Immigration Service) with the Inspector in charge here, I am told that Dase would not be able
