Sir,

I beg to enclose a cutting from the Daily Province of this city which explains itself. Teja Singh returned from Winnipeg on the 12th inst. and made preparations for his departure for England.

He has left the management of the Mining and Trust Company in the hands of a committee of 12 who are now at the head of the West Indian colony. As to how the affairs of the company, and in particular that of the Trust Company, will be carried on it is hard to say, as Teja was the only well-read and educated of the whole community.

Complications will arise in matters concerning their affairs and when brought to light it will be seen to what extent Teja Singh proved to his fellow-countrymen.

It has not been disclosed whether Teja Singh will return to this country, but in all probability he will go to New York and carry on his studies if he does not continue his fine arts education with colleagues in London and before then in all probability he will place the case concerning the company here.
