Sir,

I return to you herewith the carbon copy of your letter of the 7th inst. to Lord I-neshorough and papers attached thereto.

The man Rahim, referred to in this correspondence arrived at Vancouver as a tourist passenger on the S.S. Hesse, 14th Jan., 1920, and was admitted as a tourist desiring to visit Montreal. Not five months later, finding that Rahim had returned to Vancouver and was apparently settling there, our Agent wrote to him calling his attention to his position under subsection 10, of sec. 23 of the Immigration Act. In response to the Agent's letter Mr. Rahim went to see him and stated that his home had been in Delhi, where his father carried on a drygoods business. This business had been sold and for a number of years past Rahim had been living on his money, travelling from place to place, going finally to Honolulu, where he remained 27 months before his visit to Canada. After entering Canada as a tourist and visiting Montreal, he returned to Vancouver and started business in that city, taking the management of the Canada-India Supply and Trust Co., Ltd., a company incorporated under the laws of British Columbia, in which he bought shares. The Company appears to carry on a real estate business exclusively, under the management of some members of the Hindu community in Vancouver. Our Agent at Vancouver in reporting the case on the 15th ultimo stated as follows:-
