


**INCS 392 - Immigration & Social Integration:
the Indo-Canadian Experience**

This course focuses on the lived experience of Indo-Canadians to explore the impact of cultural transfer for immigrants from the Indian subcontinent. A century of cultural adjustment and integration will be explored in the context of cross-cultural relations and conflict. Students will examine the use of social services (in its broadest definition) by the Indo-Canadian community. Integration into the social, educational, cultural, and economic areas will also be explored. Intergenerational conflict will be discussed as well as the experience of second and third generation individuals.

This course is particularly relevant to students interested in having a better understanding of the diversity in the Fraser Valley.
