Hakam Singh Dhaliwal Transcription  
Interview Date: January 15<sup>th</sup>, 2015

MB: What is your name?  
HD: Hakam Singh Dhaliwal  
MB: And when were you born?  
HD: July 14, 1959, India.  
MB: And in what village were you born?  
HD: Chanaudal, District Barnala, Punjab.  
MB: And when did you immigrate to Canada?  
HD: I came on February 18, 1985.  
MB: How old were you?  
HD: (Some talking) 15-16.  
MB: And on what basis did you come?  
HD: My father had sent for us.  
MB: Okay, so your father was already here? Who all did he sponsor over?  
HD: Yes, it was me, my sister, and my mother.  
MB: By sponsoring.  
HD: Yes.  
MB: Alright. So since when had your father been gone?  
HD: He had come 15 years prior. He came in 1972.  
MB: And in what terms did he come? Was he finding work?  
HD: No our Baba's brother, Paul Singh, had sent for him. At that time there was a law for sponsoring refugees. He came through that.  
MB: So that was after his wedding of course. You were born.  
HD: Yes, we were just kids. When he came there were three of us. Then in '85 when he came back my sister was born.  
MB: And what kind of work did he do when he came to Canada?  
HD: Mostly drove the truck. He had his own company of his uncle's.  
MB: Alright, now I'll ask you questions about when you came. But first I want to ask, did you do any work in Punjab before coming to Canada?  
HD: No, I was studying.  
MB: What were you studying?  
HD: I was going to graduate but had a year left.  
MB: In what studies?  
HD: Well I have to clear the basic studies after passing the tenth grade. I was just in the middle of the studies and then I came here.  
MB: Oh, okay. The plus 1 and plus 2 studies?  
HD: Yes.  
MB: So you weren't able to finish it.  
HD: No, I never was able to. They were taking admission but I never went ahead. I studied just 7-8 months.  
MB: Okay, so you have completed your studies till the tenth grade then.  
HD: Yes.
