

## [Transcription of interview with Mohinder Singh Gidda]

Mohinder Singh Gidda Transcription  
Interview Date: November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2014

MB: What is your name?  
MG: My name is Mohinder Singh Gidda.  
MB: And when were you born?  
MG: June 15, 1949.  
MB: And where were you born?  
MG: Village Pathlawa, Punjab, India.  
MB: Pathlawa?  
MG: Pathlawa P-A-T-I-H-A-W-A, Punjab, India. The district used to be in Amritsar then. Now it is now Jalandhar.  
MB: Yeah. And was that where you lived, in Pathlawa, Punjab?  
MG: No, in Sugjan.  
MB: Sugjan? What is the spelling?  
MG: S-U-J-A-N.  
MB: Sugjan. So you were born in Pathlawa and you lived in Sugjan.  
MG: Pathlawa, Pathlawa.  
MB: Are had you studied there?  
MG: Yes, I did my grade ten there first. Then after that I went to tech school in Phagwara.  
MB: Tech School?  
MG: Yeah, industrial training in...  
MB: So, after the tenth grade?  
MG: I finished grade ten in '68. In '68 I then went to Phagwara. It used to be called ITA, then Industrial Training Centre, or called ITC or ITI, Industrial Training Institute, yeah.  
MB: And so you finished your education there then? Your degree?  
MG: Yes, over there I learned trades for radios and TVs.  
MB: How long did you study then?  
MG: It was for 2 years. And after that I did a one-year apprenticeship then.  
MB: Where?  
MG: Patti, District Hoshiarpur.  
MB: Oh, okay.  
MG: P-A-T-T-I. I think D-I.  
MB: Patti.  
MG: Yeah, District Hoshiarpur. There I did road work.  
MB: You started by doing road work?  
MG: The apprenticeship, yeah. One year. One year apprenticeship.  
MB: Then?  
MG: So, that's '70 I did two years of school and 1 year apprenticeship, '70. Then in '70 I opened my own shop in Neas She.
