Hindus are leaving Victoria now to Vancouver about 100 hundred out of work not a single suitable residence for rent in Vancouver. Hindus cannot find work so men appeal to could not care. Hindu authorities on Saturday referred Hindus to 14 or 15 buildings now occupied by the moment or opportunity conditions. Hindus wanted large room houses are located and equipped it with sanitary arrangements. Tests over whether and besides to want any house. I prefer Lance Survey at Brockton Park since there, about five hundred will and can afford dollars at least to make it comfortable heating equipment for keeping cool heating. Rent fifty dollars per month. Have ten hundred Hindus in it now and expect by Wednesday to have all unoccupied for under \$1000. Report about five hundred will get work within 6 months on railway construction near Vancouver. Contractors have rented it. White Knights due to absolute lack of reliable accommodations. If further information continues imperative that suitable shelter be arranged for at once. Private parties offer to meet their buildings if assured of continued immigration, but could not have it ready sooner than six months. General opinion that Federal Govt. should endeavor to solve present shelter problem.
