Mr. Borden
T. R. E. McInnes to Borden 2 Dec 1913

I can provide a solution of the Hindu
problem in British Columbia. I believe
I would be satisfactory to the most majority
in the province - Hindus and Sikhs!
Alas!

I am as sure of being able to do
it as I was of predicting the dangerous
activities of the Anti-Canadian League
in 1909. I did I could do it in the
same way - mostly practically
unknown in the matter but having
a few hand subject only to direct order
of the Government.

I have some important and reliable
news concerning the activities of Dr. Sunder
Singh.

I had an interview some weeks ago
with Dr. Rooker. He is assured at the
time of my writing that his opinion in
the West could properly handle any
Oriental problem, including a strike
by the Hindustani & Vancouver. He had
been to the West, disorganizing
the strike, the Court, and other
things. He took a ship first for (some ship)
and then to the coast of the captain.
A small letter has subsequently departed
a hundred ordinary Hindus (for the
most part) (B. L. Wagon Singh).
It is the morning the support of the Hindus
& the Hindus that you shall be able to
Darius as a supporter, however. But
there is a great deal of Hindu opinion
concerning the Hindus and the Hindus. It is
impossible to write all that is involved.
