Sir,

During the last week a man named Sunder Singh in conjunction with Kumar and a few other leaders of the Hindu community, have worked up a plan to bring out Hindus from India. The arrangements as far as I know are (a) to have a man in Calcutta to select Hindus, purchase their tickets, have them medically examined and put them on board the steamer, (b) supply them with sufficient funds to meet the requirements of the Immigration Act. The money is to be forwarded from here, and on arrival of the immigrant and his landing will be collected from him. The man selected for the Calcutta end of the work is one named Hira Lall, who returned to India on the last Express of Japan, which sailed from this port on the 11th instant. Sunder Singh and the others will
