


**Newsclipping - Vancouver News-Advertiser: [Story on comments by W. D. Scott,

Story on comment by W. D. Scott Dept of
Immigration made when he was in Toronto.
Scott projected an immigration for 1907 of
280,000 compared with 215,000 for 1906. The
increase he said was largely from Great Britain
& the continent. There was a sharp falling off
of settlers from the U.S. On Japanese question,
he thought the trouble was over. Japanese
immigration would be restricted as a result of
Mr. LaRoche's mission to Japan. He
attributed the trouble in Vancouver to labor
unions. Said that Rhodes was utterly unsuited
to country & that their immigration should be
curtailed. Chinese labor was good & limited to
certain kinds of labor.
